

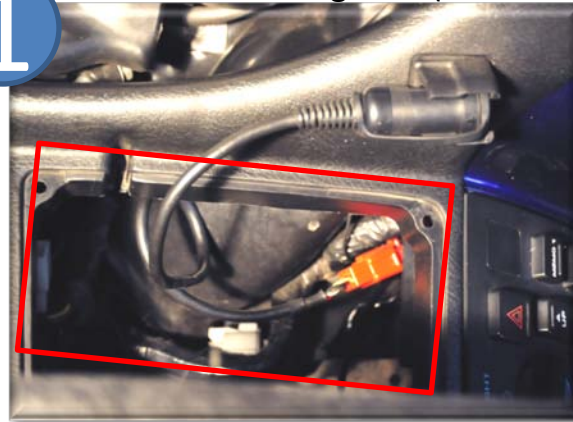
EdSets GL1800/1500 Microphone Signal Splitter for GPS

A: Optional Audio Extension for AUDIO from GPS to AX B: Mic Splitter C: Mic signal plug for GPS
D: Insert to Headset Square plug. E: Insert over Radio smaller plug.

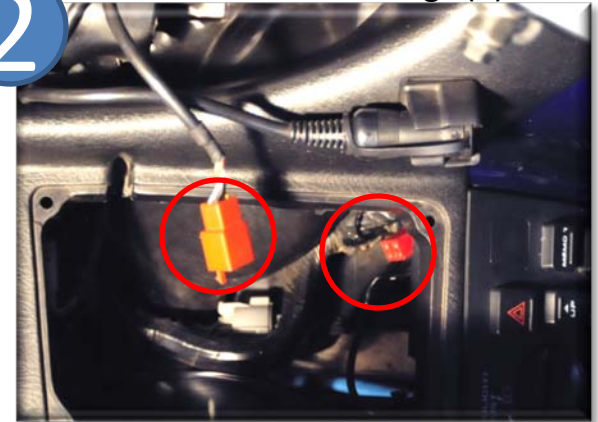


Easy Installation Guide

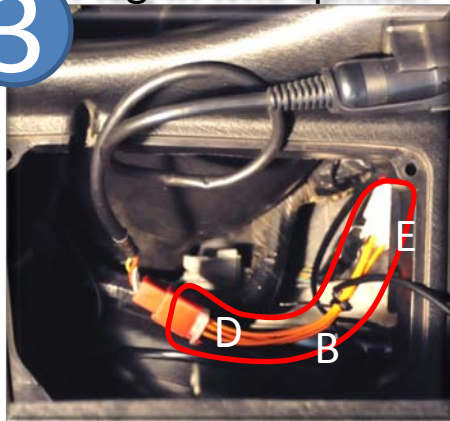
1 Remove Left Storage Bin (4 inserts)



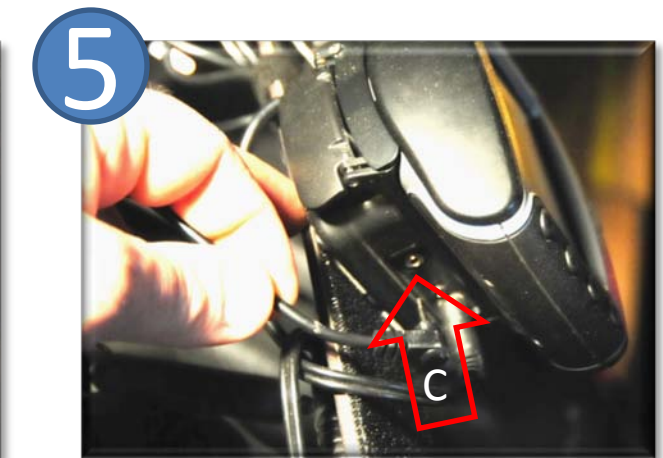
2 Disconnect Headset Plugs (2)



3 Plug in Mic Splitter



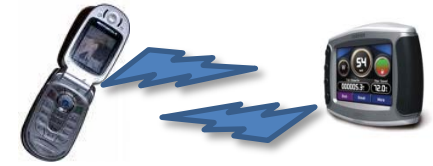
4 Route Mic Wire to GPS



- 1 Release 4 push pins to release bin. Follow headset lead to find square plugs.
- 2 Press the barb on left plug to release the audio connectors, usually red.
- 3 Mic splitter goes between factory plugs. If you have mic mutes place them after Mic Splitter from headset jack.
- 4 If you have optional audio cable (A) for GPS -> AUX input, route it at same time as you route mic wire to GPS
- 5 The 2.5mm mic signal plug (C) goes into cradle, GPS cable, or unit depending on model. Zumo 550 shown.

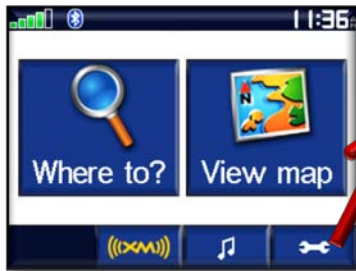

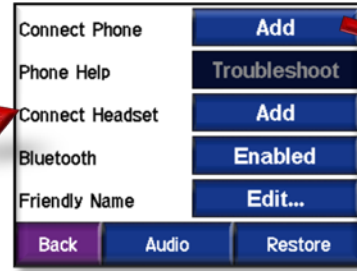
1. If you don't already have your phone Bluetooth paired with the Zumo, follow these general steps:



Touch the 'wrench' icon



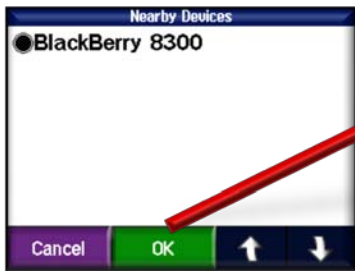
Touch "Bluetooth" icon



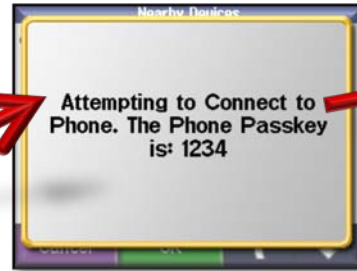
Touch "Add"



Set phone to 'find me' mode



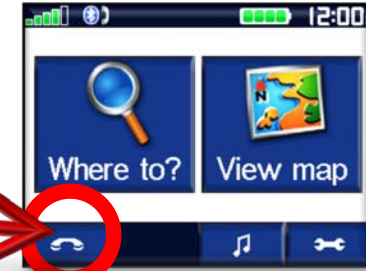
Your phone appears in list



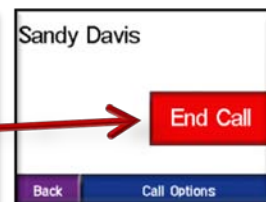
Your may need to supply the passkey on your phone's keypad



Pairing is complete and you can make calls



Touch the handset icon to initiate a call.
